# b. Deputy Prime Minister.....Dante Pio

- i. January 29th Ancillary Fee Protocol Meeting
  - Instead of a 3% increase, it will be CPI.
  - Discussed things they would like to change.

  - Discussed terminology/glossary changes.
- ii. February 1<sup>st</sup> Meeting with Pig's Ear Tavern

# c. Minister of Inter-Collegiate Affairs......Kyra Myderwyk

- i. Orientation Subcommittee Report
  - Attended on January 31st.
  - 180 students attended winter orientation.
  - Currently hiring orientation week facilitators.
  - We have some of the lowest orientation week costs compared to other universities.
  - Last orientation week, the cost was \$172 per leader, food was \$56,000, materials were \$25,000, Kyra discussed the other parts of the budget.
  - Asking for a 5% increase, each first-year student would pay \$170.38 each for orientation.
  - Expecting \$19,500 total from cabinets, and \$30,000 total from colleges.
  - \$313,790 is the expected budget. This is about \$30,000 from last year.
  - They will not be removing Playfair, it usually costs \$4,000.
  - They will be reducing costs by reusing orientation week shirts and putting pre-week for orientation leaders online.
  - Dante asks if it will be synchronous or asynchronous, Kyra assumes it will be synchronous Zoom calls.
  - There won't be big events on the Thursday and Friday of O-Week.
  - They are going to reuse some materials from last year such as tents.
  - Any extra money will go to food costs.
  - Last year they spent \$62,000 on feeding the leaders. Dante discussed the meal plan system.
  - They will not be having meal tickets for leaders this year to save money. The meal tickets are used to feed the leaders on the Thursday and Friday of orientation week.
  - Kyra asked questions at the meeting and went over the answers they gave.

*Motion*: That the 5% increase to the CASSC Orientation budget, be supported, and that Cabinet direct the CASSC representative to vote in favour.
