

# **Species Association in Vegetation Communities** of the Trent Nature Areas

#### **Wetland Communities**

#### Marsh Meadow

**Trees**: white cedar, ash **Shrubs**: dogwood

**Herbaceous Plants**: spotted Joe-pye-weed, sensitive fern, naked miterwort, meadow horsetail, ostrich fern S. atrovirens, S. cyperinus and C. vulpinoides water-plantain, burr- reed emergents, Canada goldenrod, graminoid species, boneset, and canary reed-grass.

# **Shallow Marsh**

Shrubs: Shrubby willows

Herbaceous Plants: cattails, Galium spp., sedges, grasses

# Shrub Marsh

Shrubs: nannyberry, shrubby willow, dogwood

# **Swamp Communities**

# Thicket Swamp

Shrubs: Shrubby willows dominate

#### **Deciduous Swamp**

Trees: trembling aspen, balsam poplar, red ash, black ash, white cedar, silver maple

Herbaceous Plants: graminoids, marsh marigold, jewelweed

#### Mixed Swamp

Trees: red ash, white birch, cedar, bitternut hickory

## Coniferous Swamp

Trees: Cedar

Herbaceous Plants: two species of Sphagnum

#### **Forests**

## **Deciduous Forest**

**Trees**: American beech, white ash, red oak, burr oak, sugar maple, blue beech, ironwood, white birch, black cherry, basswood, bitternut hickory and butternut

**Shrubs**: leatherwood, riverbank grape, Virginia creeper, false honeysuckle, European buckthorn **Herbaceous Plants**: wild ginger, wild leek, bellwort, Trillium, hepatica, columbine, toothwort

Mixed Forest

**Trees**: Black locust

**Coniferous Forest** 

Trees: Cedar, white pine, hemlock

**Conifer Plantation Forest** 

Trees: red pine

#### Woodlands

**Deciduous Woodland** 

Trees: sugar maple, white ash, iron wood black cherry

Herbaceous Plants: Carex spicata

Coniferous Woodland

Trees: cedar, eastern hemlock, white spruce and balsam fir

Mixed Woodland

Trees: white cedar, aspen, and black ash

Sparse Deciduous Woodland

Shrubs: sumacs

Sparse Coniferous Woodland

Trees: white cedar, red cedar
