

# Trent University

Trent University is a fully accredited university with full membership in the Council of Ontario Universities (COU), Universities Canada, and the Association of Commonwealth Universities (ACU). Created by *The Trent University Act, 1963*, the University offers undergraduate and graduate programs.

The graduate academic year consists of three terms: Spring (May through August), Fall (September through December), and Winter (January through April).

The undergraduate academic year consists of a Fall/Winter session (two twelve-week terms, September through December and January through April). Summer session consists of twelve-week, eight-week, and six-week terms (May through August).

Note regarding course numbers: Trent University uses a three-, four-, or five-digit number for undergraduate and graduate courses.

During the 2019-20 Fall-Winter and 2020 Winter terms, the University was affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. In some courses, the syllabus was changed to re-weight course work and exams. As an accommodation in those terms, some students were granted a PASS in lieu of a numerical grade due to extenuating circumstances.

## Undergraduate Grading System

Standings in courses are shown by letter grades and numerical marks. Failing grades which do not show a numerical equivalent are assumed to be the value of zero.

In light of a faculty strike students registered and in good standing in a course during the 1990-1991 Fall/Winter session could elect to receive a "Pass" grade in lieu of a numerical grade.

Numerical Marks were introduced as *official grades* on the transcript in September 1981. In September 1977, numerical percentage *equivalents* were established for the six letter grades. Prior to September 1972 there were five grades consisting of A, B, C, D, F.

### Transfer Credits

Beginning January 2001, all transfer credits are assigned a "P" grade.

### Letter of Permission

Beginning May 2015, credits completed on a Letter of Permission are assigned the following grades:

A full credit course normally consists of three class contact hours each week for a full academic year (September to April) or 72 hours. Courses with a laboratory component will normally exceed three class contact hours per week. Summer session full course credits represent the equivalent number of class contact hours within a shorter period of time. Each full credit course is considered equivalent to six semester hours or nine quarter-hours. All online courses adhere to the credit value definitions listed below.
