Some (but not all) aspects of archaeological field work involve strenuous physical activity, including lifting heavy items, awkward movements, and walking over difficult/uneven terrain. Field methods often involve visual as well as tactile evaluation of materials, and the ability to use analogue tools (pencils and graph paper) for recording purposes.
