School Placements

- Public or Catholic school systems

- Private school (e.g., Trinity College School; Lakefield College School; Upper Canada College)
- Private Alternative school (e.g., Waldorf; Montessori)

You might like to consider contacting a school in your home area and completing a full week of placement during Reading Week. This is a great opportunity to see the full work of a classroom and the staff, it will give you some fascinating insights into the work of a teacher.

Arts/Culture

- Museums (e.g., Municipal museums; heritage museum; Museum of History; Textile Museum of Canada; Bata Shoe Museum; Royal Ontario Museum)
- Art Galleries (e.g., Municipal gallery; Art Gallery of Ontario; McMichael Art Gallery; cooperative artist gallery)
- Theatre or other performance space/organization (e.g., Canadian Stage Company; Mississauga Living Arts Centre; Canadian Opera Company; Young People Theatre; 4th Line Theatre)
- Campus-community radio station (e.g., Trent Radio)
- Music or art therapy
- Heritage Canada (federal department of culture and heritage)
- Developing and touring of a music/drama/arts program to schools

- International Organizations (e.g., UNICEF)
- Seniors' centre education programming
- Alternative learning centres (e.g., adult learning centre; Trent Valley Literacy; Learning Disabilities Association of Peterborough)
- Hospital (e.g., chronic care; paediatrics-educational programming)
- Organizations such as the Heart and Stroke Foundation (e.g., health promotion and social development; health and safety programs)
- Human Rights Commission

- Library - local, provincial, national, or organizational based (e.g., researching new materials; afterschool programs; working in the education department of a library such as the Library of Parliament or a District School Board Resource Centre)
