WHICH PATHWAY TO NURSING WILL YOU CHOOSE?

The Trent/Fleming School of Nursing offers four program options, including programs in collaboration with Fleming College and in partnership with George Brown College.

- 1. Collaborative Four-Year B.Sc.N. Degree: For students entering from high school or those who have completed some postsecondary education. A 36-month option is also available. Page 4
- 2. Compressed 28-Month B.Sc.N. Program: Fast track program for students who have completed at least two years of an undergraduate degree or graduates from Practical Nursing (P.N.) diploma programs at Colleges including Fleming, Durham, Centennial, and Seneca. Page 6
- 3. Bridge/Post-Bridge Practical Nursing (P.N.) to B.Sc.N. Pathway: For recent graduates from any recognized Ontario community college Practical Nursing (P.N.) diploma program who are registered in good standing with the College of Nurses of Ontario. Page 8
- 4. Diploma in Foundations of Indigenous Studies for Future Nursing Students: A two-year program for Indigenous students who have the equivalent of Grade 12 or who qualify as mature students looking to bridge into Nursing. Page 9





Admission Requirements

Applying from High School

Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD); completed prerequisite course equivalents: ENG4U (min. 70%), SBI4U (min. 70%), SCH4U (min. 70%), and any 4U Math (min. 70%); a minimum average of 75% calculated on the required courses, plus your next best two 4U/M courses.

Applying from College

A completed pre-health science (university stream) certificate program OR two semesters of a diploma program at a recognized college with a minimum average of 75%, including two semesters each of English (min. 70% each), Biology (min. 65% each), Chemistry (min. 65% each), and Math (min. 65%) OR a completed Practical Nursing diploma from a recognized college with a minimum average of 75%.

Applying from University

At least 4.0 undergraduate credits, including one semester of English (min. 60%), Biology (min. 60% each), Chemistry (min. 60%), and Math (min. 60% each); a minimum average of 70% calculated on the last credits taken up to a maxiumm of 10.0 credits, or the same subject prerequisite requirements met at the high school or college level, as outlined above.

Did you know? In Trent's collaborative and compressed B.Sc.N. programs you have the option of heading to Central America as part of a community health brigade in your second year. This 12-day placement in either Honduras or Guatemala will give you the opportunity to support primary healthcare needs in both urban and rural settings and provide important education on topics such as sexual health, family planning, gender equality, nutrition, dental care and clean water access. Install and maintain clean water filters; help develop community gardens; or complete small construction projects to aid and assist communities in healthy daily living. Trent nursing students have done it all.

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING COMPRESSED PROGRAM

FAST TRACK YOUR NURSING DEGREE


Already have some credits that can be transferred toward your nursing degree? This compressed program will take you from the classroom to the nursing career of your dreams even faster. If you are a recent graduate from Centennial, Durham, Fleming, or Seneca Colleges' Practical Nursing diploma programs, or are transferring from another university, this program follows the same curriculum as the collaborative program, while allowing you to graduate with an honours degree in Nursing (B.Sc.N.) in just 28 months.

We recognize your hard work. Study in Trent's renowned nursing program with the added benefit of applying previous credits earned. You will also have the option to do research and complete an undergraduate thesis in your final two semesters.

Career Experience

- Practice the skills learned in your lectures and readings in weekly simulation labs in Trent's newly expanded, state-of-the-art clinical learning centre, designed to replicate hospital and home settings
- · Get career experience beyond the traditional hospital setting by presenting original work at regional health conferences or by participating in health projects in the community
- Complete an optional field placement in rural Honduras or Guatemala
- Choose to work in northern Ontario for one of your fourth-year placements this might just result in an interesting and well-paying career opportunity!



Admission Requirements

Applying from College

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Recent graduates from Practical Nursing diploma programs from colleges including Centennial, Durham, Fleming, and Seneca who are registered in good standing with the CNO will be considered for admission with a minimum GPA of 3.0 (75%); eligible for a block transfer of 5.0 full credits. The CNO registration requirement will be waived for graduates who have completed their PN program within the six months prior to admission at Trent.

Transferring from Another University

Secondary school 4U or college prerequisite courses as listed for the Collaborative program, or one semester of: Biology (min. 60%), Chemistry (min. 60%), Math (min. 60%), 1.0 full credit in an Introductory Psychology course*, 2.0 full credits at the 1000 level (first year), 1.0 full credit at the 2000 level (second year); a minimum GPA of 2.7 (70%) calculated on the last ten (10) university full course equivalents (two years of an undergraduate degree program).

For admission considerations, prerequisites must have been completed within the last ten years.

* For admission consideration, Intro to Psychology courses must have been completed within the past ten years. Applicants with sufficient upper year transfer credits may have this course requirement waived for admission.





BRIDGE/POST-BRIDGE PRACTICAL NURSING (P.N.) TO B.Sc.N. PATHWAY

Start the Next Chapter of Your Nursing Career in Toronto

Looking to advance your career? Our P.N. to B.Sc.N. pathway in partnership with George Brown College allows graduates from a two-year community college P.N. diploma program in Ontario, who are in good standing with the CNO, to upgrade your qualification. Upon completion of the George Brown Bridge Certificate program, you'll enter the Trent Post-Bridge B.Sc.N. program. Graduates of the Post-Bridge program can become Registered Nurses (R.N.) in Ontario

- Earn your B.Sc.N. in just over three years as a full-time student or five years as a part-time student

Admission Requirements

- Completion of a Practical Nursing diploma from a recognized community college with a minimum average of 75% with no failed or repeated courses
- Registered in good standing with no practice restrictions with the College of Nurses of Ontario
- No less than 70% in any course of the Bridge program for which transfer credits are granted

Students who successfully complete all Bridge certificate courses with a minimum cumulative average of 75% will move on to Trent's Bachelor of Science in Nursing program, offered at the George Brown campus.

DEMENTIA STUDIES NURSING GRADUATE DIPLOMA

As the number of Canadians living with dementia continues to increase, the Nursing Graduate Diploma in Dementia Studies is designed for registered nurses who wish to become leaders in this specialized area of care. Ideal for working nursing professionals, this five-course program is delivered over five semesters and includes online readings, discussions, and assignments, complemented by online and in-person workshops with a variety of active learning and simulation experiences.

MENTAL HEALTH & ADDICTIONS NURSING GRADUATE DIPLOMA

Trent's Nursing Graduate Diploma in Mental Health & Addictions is the first of its kind in Ontario and allows you to complement your career experience by pursuing specialized knowledge in this high-demand nursing field. Designed for working professionals, the five-course program is delivered over five semesters through online coursework and two eight-hour workshops with activities including role play and simulated practice in addition to more traditional learning.

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MASTER OF SCIENCE IN NURSING (M.Sc.N.)

Trent's Master of Science in Nursing (M.Sc.N.) program, offered in collaboration with Ontario Tech University, focuses on professional practice leadership and prepares graduates to contribute to an increasingly complex healthcare sector by providing an education that includes mentorship, interdisciplinary opportunities, and experiential learning through research, projects, and class assignments. Our flexible program allows for online learning and the choice between thesis-based and projectbased research.

Admission Requirements

To bridge from this diploma program into the compressed nursing program, you must meet the following requirements:

- Successful completion of the Diploma in Foundations of Indigenous Learning with a minimum average of 70%
- Minimum of 60% in PSYC 1020H, PSYC 1030H, BIOL 1050H, BIOL 1051H, along with any prerequisite courses (Chemistry and/or Mathematics) not previously completed as a 4U secondary school credit



JANET BEWS SCHOLARSHIP IN ALZHEIMER DISEASE AND **RELATED DEMENTIAS** (\$5,000)

Awarded to one or two collaborative student(s) enrolled in Nursing courses at the 3000 or 4000 level or compressed students enrolled in 2000-level Nursing courses, who show a career interest in nursing care for persons with dementia.

JUNE WOODEND SCHOLARSHIP IN COMMUNITY PALLIATIVE **CARE NURSING** (\$1,000)

Awarded to a student in second or third year of the collaborative or compressed Nursing Program, who shows a career interest in community-based palliative care.

DOREEN (LARMER) STEWART NURSING SCHOLARSHIP (\$2,500)

Awards are available to full-time nursing students in any year of study in the TFSON.
