Minimum Admission Requirements

- One semester in an accredited Canadian university, with a cumulative average of 65% (2.0 GPA on a scale of 4.0) will be considered for admission to Trent University
- A minimum grade of 60% is required in any university course to be considered for course-by-course transfer credit assessment
- Up to a maximum of 10.0 credits (two years of full-time study) may be applied to an undergraduate degree at Trent University
- One semester of a university course can be used to satisfy pre-requisites

1. TRANSFER INTO (ALMOST) ANY TRENT DEGREE

Here at one of Ontario's most transfer-credit-friendly universities, we make it easy for you to take the next step into degree studies. In fact, transfer credits from college can be applied to nearly any Trent program. We'll even work with you to assess your transfer credits and make sure you are making the most of your college credits.

- If you have completed at least one semester in a recognized Canadian college, with a cumulative average of 65% (2.0 GPA on a scale of 4.0), you are eligible for admission to many programs at Trent
- Two-semesters of many college program courses can be used to satisfy many degree program pre-requisites
- The minimum course average needed for automatic transfer credit assessment is 70%

* Minimum admissions average does not guarantee admission; these are competitive capped programs, so the competitive average can fluctuate year-to-year depending on the applicant pool.

WHAT YOU NEED TO **KNOW ABOUT TRANSFER** CREDITS

"Transfer credits" refer to courses taken at one institution that are credited toward a degree or diploma at another institution. Up to 10.0 transfer credits (or the equivalent of up to two years), may be applied to your honours degree at Trent University. There are three types of transfer credits:

- **1. Assigned Credits:** An assigned credit is granted when the content of a course at another university or college is considered an exact equivalent to a course at Trent.
- 2. Unassigned Departmental Credits: An unassigned departmental credit is granted when the course materials from another university or college are comparable with the subject material in a discipline at Trent University for which there is not an equivalent course.
- 3. Unassigned General Credits: An unassigned general credit is granted when the subject of the course is not taught at Trent.

Note: All transfer credits are recorded as a "pass" grade. Numerical grades are not entered on the student record.

APPLYING TO TRENT

CLASSES START September, January, or May

1. APPLY TO TRENT

There are two ways to submit your application. Apply directly to Trent by visiting trentu.ca/pathways and we will waive the application fee, or apply online through OUAC (Ontario Universities' Application Centre) by visiting ouac.on.ca

2. SEND YOUR TRANSCRIPTS

- If you're in your first semester of first year, send your transcripts once grades become available
- If you have completed your first semester, send in your transcripts with your application
- When you've completed your studies, and you have received your final grades, submit your final official transcript to Trent
- It is important to remember that Trent will always require official transcripts – direct from your previous institution – to meet the conditions of your offer
- Trent can, and will, evaluate your application based off of unofficial transcripts

▲ 3. RECEIVE YOUR OFFER

Successful applicants will receive an offer of admission by email. At this time, your preliminary transfer credit assessment will be posted under 'Transfer Credit' in your myTrent portal

- Trent may request course syllabi to assess remaining transfer credits. Transfer credit assessments are typically completed within four weeks after syllabi are submitted

4. ACCEPT YOUR OFFER

Before accepting an offer of admission, you should carefully review your offer. Be sure to accept your offer of admission as early as possible as some

programs and courses have limited enrolment and may fill up quickly. Accept your offer of admission where you applied at **ouac.on.ca** or by emailing admissions@trentu.ca (if you applied directly to Trent)

Apply to Trent Early! Programs with higher admission requirements may have specific application deadlines, so be sure to apply early!



Top Ranked Student Experience



Diploma to Doctorate

Trent alumna **Kelly McLean**'s postsecondary journey started with an education pathway from Fleming College to a Bachelor of Science in Biology at Trent. Now, her academic career is steeped in science as she pursues her doctorate, working with the Canadian Wildlife Service to equip 80 cranes with transmitters to determine fine scale habitat use, migration timing and strategies, and help answer today's most pressing ecological questions.

"Science is all about asking questions, and I think that asking and answering relevant questions is very important in wildlife management. I was once told that in college, you learn what sort of things you can ask questions about; in your undergrad, you learn what sort of questions you can ask; in your master's, you learn how to ask those questions; and during your Ph.D., you actually answer the questions. It's true!"
