

### Program Requirements

- Degree requirements must be met within 7 years of admission to the Nursing program.
- Students must maintain a GPA of at least 65% in the program.
- Students will be allowed to repeat one NURS theory course for which they have received a grade lower than 60%. Failure to raise this grade to 60% or better will result in withdrawal from the program. Students who receive a second grade lower than 60% in a NURS theory course will be removed from the program.
- Students will be allowed to repeat one failed Nursing practice course over the duration of the program. A second failing grade in a Nursing practice course will result in a withdrawal from the program.
- Students who fail 2.0 credits will be removed from the BScN program but not the university.
- Attendance at learning activities in the TFSON Clinical Simulation Hub, orientation to clinical practice and clinical practice is mandatory. Failure to attend learning activities with the simulation hub or clinical practice may result in a failing grade. Failure to attend orientation will result in the students being removed from the clinical practice course and any related classroom co-requisites.
- All other program requirements can be found in the University Academic Calendar and Trent/Fleming School of Nursing Student Handbook. It is the student's responsibility to familiarize themselves with both of these resources.

### Forced Choice Electives

In year 3 semester 6, collaborative students will select a forced choice elective. Students may choose from NURS 3560H Advanced Pathophysiology & Pharmacology, PHIL 2390H Biomedical Ethics, PSYC 3560H Family Development, PSYC 3750H Health Psychology, or SOCI-GESO 2430H Sociology of Gender. Students should familiarize themselves with any required prerequisites in order to plan their degree appropriately.

### Advanced Topics

In each of a student's final two semesters, an advanced topic will be required. Advanced topics are 4000 level nursing theory courses, typically instructed via an online format. Students are required to obtain one advanced topic from each of group 1 and group 2. NURS 4100 level courses are considered group 1 and NURS 4200 level courses are considered group 2. Alternatively, NURS-INDG 4740Y or the 4th year thesis option - NURS 4011H & 4012H - may be selected to complete this requirement. Students can check the academic timetable to determine which courses are being offered in a term as well as the academic calendar for course descriptions.

# COLLABORATIVE COURSE MAP

Requirement for students beginning at Trent as of Fall 2018!

0.5 credit of the courses listed on this program map must be from the Indigenous Credit Requirement (ICR) approved list

## YEAR 1

### Semester 1 (Fall)

Take 2.5 credits from the following list:

- NURS 1000H: Individual as a Nurse
- NURS 1001H: Nursing as a Profession
- BIOL 1050H: Human Anatomy
- NURS 1550H: Introductory Life Sciences for Health Professionals
- 0.5 elective credit at the 1000 level

### Semester 2 (Winter)

Take 2.5 credits from the following list:

- NURS 1002H: Introduction to Foundational Practice Concepts *and*
- NURS 1020H: Clinical Practice in a Residential Setting
- BIOL 1051H: Human Physiology
- PSYC 1020H *or* 1030H: Introduction to Psychology
- 0.5 elective credit at the 1000 level

#### YEAR 1 TIP:

You can take two 0.5 elective credits or one 1.0 full elective credit that will run through both semesters.

## YEAR 2

### Semester 3 (Fall)

Take 2.5 credits from the following list:

- NURS 2000H: Health Promotion & Population Health *and*
- NURS 2020H: Community-Based Nursing Practice *or* NURS 2022H: International Community Practice
- NURS 2550H: Advanced Life Sciences for Health Professionals
- PSYC 1020H *or* 1030H: Introduction to Psychology
- 0.5 elective credit at 1000 level or higher

### Semester 4 (Winter)

Take 2.5 credits from the following list:

- NURS 2001H: Family in the Community *and*
- NURS 2021H: Family Focused Practice
- NURS 2031H: Quantitative Research for Health Care Professionals
- NURS 2003H: Nursing Therapeutics and Disease
- 0.5 elective credit at the 1000 level or higher

#### YEAR 2 TIPS:

- You can switch 2000H and 2020H to semester 4 and 2001H and 2021H to semester 3.
- You can take two 0.5 elective credits or one 1.0 elective credit.
- If you took PSYC 1020H in semester 2 take PSYC 1030H in semester 3 or vice versa.

## YEAR 3

### Semester 5 (Fall)

Take 2.5 credits from the following list:

- NURS 3000H: Experiencing Acute Illness *and*
- NURS 3020H: Clinical Practice Focused on Acute Care
- NURS 3031H: Qualitative Research for Health Care Professionals
- NURS 3550H: Pharmacology for Health Professionals
- 0.5 elective credit at the 2000 level or higher

### Semester 6 (Winter)

Take 2.5 credits from the following list:

- NURS 3001H: Living with Chronic Disease *and*
- NURS 3021H: Clinical Practice with Chronic Disease
- NURS 3004H: Nurse as a Leader and Advocate
- Forced Choice Elective: NURS 3560H *or* PHIL 2390H *or* PSYC 3560H *or* PSYC 3750H *or* SOCI-GESO 2430H
- 0.5 elective credit at the 2000 level or higher

#### YEAR 3 TIPS:

- You can switch 3000H and 3020H to semester 6 and 3001H and 3021H to semester 5.
- You can switch 3031H to semester 6 and take 3004H in semester 5
- You can take two 0.5 elective credits or 1.0 elective credit.

## YEAR 4

### Semester 7 (Fall)

Take 2.5 credits from the following list:

- NURS 4020C: Independent Nursing Practice
- 0.5 Advanced Topic Group 1 or 2
- 0.5 elective credit at the 3000 level or higher

### Semester 8 (Winter)

Take 2.5 credits from the following list:

- NURS 4021C: Independent Nursing Practice
- 0.5 Advanced Topic Group 1 or 2 (opposite group of semester 7)
- 0.5 elective credit at the 3000 level or higher

#### YEAR 4 TIPS:

- If you took a group 1 Advanced Topic in semester 7 then take group 2 in semester 8 or vice versa. **You need 0.5 from each group.**
- Advanced Topic group 1 are 4100 level NURS courses. This group includes topics that would be relevant to all Nurses regardless of the practice setting (i.e. Advanced Leadership, Marginalization, etc.)
- Advanced Topic group 2 are 4200 level NURS courses. This group includes specific topics surrounding particular areas of practices or interest (i.e. Rural Nursing, Primary Health Care, etc.)
- Advanced Topic offerings rotate year to year, check current timetable to see what is available.
- A thesis, NURS 4011H & 4012H can be taken in place of the advanced topics. It is two semesters in length (1.0 credit) and therefore would count as both group 1 and group 2 Advanced Topics.
