Convocation

Since 2010, the Convocation team at Trent University has worked to reduce the environmental impact of this key event, reflecting the sustainability principles students have embraced during their time here. This focus on green living is a natural way to celebrate their achievements and inspire them to carry these values into their future careers. In collaboration with the Sustainability Office, the team continues to explore innovative ways to integrate sustainability into every aspect of the ceremonies.

Operationalizing Sustainability

- Bottled Water-Free Ceremonies: Starting in 2010,
 Convocation eliminated bottled water, reducing waste and showcasing Trent's leadership in sustainability.
- Minimal Waste Efforts: In 2023, Convocation introduced a completely digital program and implemented minimal waste lunches to further decrease environmental impact.
- Oraduation Green Pledge: Since its inception in the early 2000s, this pledge has encouraged graduates to commit to sustainable practices. In 2023, over 50% of graduating students participated, demonstrating their dedication to environmental stewardship.
- oContinuous Improvement: Convocation works closely with the Sustainability Office to adopt best practices and explore new ways to enhance the event's sustainability each year.
